The Individual Mentoring Program (IMP)

PRIMARY SCOPE => Professional and career related

One of the following scenarii is possible

- 1. The mentor's **professional role** is the one the **mentee aspires** to in the future
- 2. The mentee would like to **expand specific skills** for her career advancement: self confidence, financial mastery; leadership, etc.
- The mentees would like to expand her network in a specific area the mentor is well introduced in

WHO IS ELIGEBLE

any member of the Career Women's Forum and who is not benefitting from the Cross Mentoring Program in 2018

TIMELINE

- **8 MONTHS**: from March to November 2018
- Program end: November 2018





Basic Principles of the Program

Setting Clear Objectives

- Mentor and Mentee should agree on specific priorities to work on
- Clear Goals allow the mentor to give concrete and valuable guidance

Scheduling Quality Time

- Face to face meeting, ideally, at least once a month
- Being respectful of each other's time

Trust and Confidentiality

The mentoring relationship must create a safe zone where both mentor and mentee feel free to address difficult issues

Mutual Respect

Both the mentor and mentee values each other's qualities and contributions

Taking Responsibility

- Both mentor and mentee are accountable toward each other during the program
- Mentor should give her time and attention to the mentee during the meetings and focus as objectively as possible on the mentee
- Mentee must take responsibility on her learning: setting up the appointments, following up on advice, reporting her progress

Why be a Mentor?

- Helping Women to advance
- Expanding your leadership skills: transferring knowledge and experience, shifting focus to the success of others
- Building a new and diverse network of relationships
- Transferring your skills in a different context
- Increasing personal growth as a leader
- Leaving a legacy

Why be a Mentee?

- Gaining a long term view on your career
- Benefiting from unbiased guidance
- Having access to a discussion partner in a safe and trusted environment
- Meeting someone who you can respect and admire





Mentoring Behaviors -DOs

Mentor's role

- Be available and take time
- Listen actively
- Facilitate access to information and own network
- Challenge and help develop own thinking
- Give constructive feedback

Mentee's role

- Be clear on objectives and expectations
- Always be well prepared /send in advance the agenda points you want to discuss
- Organise meetings
- Be open minded and listen actively
- Take suggestions into account
- Ask for feedback



Mentoring Behaviors –DON-Ts

Don'ts for Mentors

- Expecting to be the perfect mentor
- Taking responsibilty for your mentee's development plan
- Judging
- Allowing your mentee to become dependent on the relationship
- Shielding your mentee from learning the lesson

Don'ts for Mentees

- Being defensive
- Expecting too much
- Asking for advice on everything
- Waiting for your mentor to act in your place
- Considering your mentor as an address book, a headhunter or guarantee for a new job
