Géraldine Savary

Géraldine Savary has been executive director of the Swiss Press Club since October 1, 2025. She began her journalism career as editor of the weekly *Domaine Public*, before being elected to the Federal Parliament, first as a National Councilor and then as a member of the Council of States. After sixteen years in the Federal Chambers, she joined Tamedia as editor-in-chief of *Femina* and head of the cultural section of *Le Matin Dimanche*.



Patrick Haack

Professor, University of Lausanne.



Patrick Haack is a Full Professor of Strategy and Responsible Management at HEC Lausanne, where he directs the Department of Strategy, Globalization and Society. He is also an International Research Fellow at Oxford's University Centre for Corporate Reputation and Director of the HEC Research Center for Grand Challenges, a hub addressing key societal and economic issues.

His research focuses on the conceptual and empirical study of legitimacy, a foundational mechanism shaping social and institutional change, - and most recently on strategies to counter fake news – including and Harvard Business Review featured study explaining why information-based responses often fail and proposing ways for organizations to maintain trust and defend truth amid today's disinformation.



Liudmila Zavolokina



Assistant Professor, University of Lausanne.

Liudmila Zavolokina is a Professor of Information Systems and Digital Innovation at the University of Lausanne. Her design- oriented research explores how emerging digital technologies and platforms foster trust and societal resilience, including her current work on AI-supported critical thinking in online news. She earned her PhD in Informatics from the University of Zurich, where she also conducted postdoctoral research, and previously worked in industry at the IT – business interface. Today, she collaborates with public and private partners on digital solutions serving communities and the public good.



Benjamin von Wyl

Benjamin von Wyl, born in 1990, is a Basel- based journalist and author. He works as a reporter and editor for democracy issues at Swissinfo, the 10-language international platform of the public broadcaster SRG. His journalistic focus is on background reports on trust, disinformation and Swiss democracy from a global perspective. In addition to his journalistic work, von Wyl is also a literary author. As a journalist and author, von Wyl has received several awards, including "Top 30 under 30" from "Schweizer Journalist: in" in 2020 and a Swiss Literature Award in 2021.



Miriam Buiten

Professor, University of St. Gallen.



Miriam Buiten is a Professor of Law & Economics at the University of St.Gallen. Her research explores how law should respond to new technologies and artificial intelligence, asking questions such as : Who is responsible when AI causes harm? How should online platforms be held accountable for the content they moderate?

And how can policymakers address the growing power of digital platforms? In 2024, she received the Latsis Prize for her work on platform governance. She is also a Research Fellow at the Centre on Regulation in Europe (CERRE), where she engages with EU policymakers and contributes to policy reports.
